A non-refundable entry fee of \$25.00 per entry up to 1sq metre.

AIBG MAPC reserves the right to refuse entries which do not comply with conditions of entry.

Works not deemed suitable will not be hung.

Late entries will not be accepted.

Artwork to win one prize only

Sale of work

All works must be for sale. 20% commission applies to the sale of all artworks and must be included in the price.

Presentation

All works must arrive ready for display with picture hanging rings and wire attached one third from the top of works and labelled on the back.

Judging

The judges' decision will be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

Copyright

Entry will grant AIBG MAPC permission to reproduce artworks entered in the show for non-commercial purposes, including the promotion of the Magenta Art Prize.

AIBG MAPC shall have the right to exhibit the winning entry at such times and at such places and to cause or permit photographs or filming of the work in such newspapers, magazines, catalogues (for sale or not) and on all electronic media at such time or times as it may in its discretion determine. All necessary acknowledgements of authorship will be duly made.

Acquisitive Prize

The recipient of the acquisitive art prize/s agrees to transfer ownership and rights of the awarded artwork/s to AIBG upon acceptance of the prize. This transfer includes all associated copyrights, allowing AIBG exclusive rights to display, reproduce, and distribute the artwork. The winning artist will be duly credited for their creation in all exhibitions and publications where the artwork is showcased.

Fine Art Category Definitions

Botanical

Precise visual representations of plant life, merging scientific accuracy with artistic skill across diverse mediums. These artworks intricately detail plant morphology, emphasising form, colour, and texture, serving scientific, educational, and aesthetic purposes by offering meticulous depictions for study and appreciation.

Flora & Fauna

Artworks spotlighting either plant life (flora) or animal life (fauna). These pieces celebrate the beauty, diversity, and unique traits of botanical or zoological subjects through various artistic mediums. They aim to educate, intrigue, and aesthetically portray the intricacies of these life forms.

Portrait

Visual representations, encompassing paintings, drawings, or photographs that capture an individual's likeness and essence. These artworks convey physical features, personality, and emotions, often revealing character through facial expressions, gestures, and nuanced appearances.

Landscape

Visual depictions showcasing natural environments, encompassing mountains, valleys, rivers, or forests. These artworks capture the essence and beauty of outdoor scenery, employing light, colour, and texture to evoke a sense of place, atmosphere, and emotional resonance.

Sculpture

All 3D work including relief & 'in the round'

Sculptural work should be less than a cubic metre and of a weight less than 25kgs. Entrants, please consider the display method and provide a pedestal and or plinth if required.

Photography Category Definitions

Botanical- Photography

Botanical Photography is the art of capturing plants and their various parts, such as flowers, leaves, stems, and seeds, through photography. It focuses on showcasing the beauty, structure, and intricate details of flora, often with an emphasis on scientific accuracy, artistic composition, or both. This genre of photography serves to document and celebrate plant life, playing a vital role in botany, education, conservation, and artistic expression.

Macro

Photography showcasing subjects at a magnification ratio of at least 1:1, revealing intricate details unseen by the naked eye. These images capture life-sized or larger representations, emphasising fine details, textures, and patterns to offer a highly detailed and enlarged perspective.

Monochrome

A photograph or picture developed or executed in black and white or in varying tones of only one colour.

Open Section

May include digital, abstract, composite and artistically edited photographic works

Photography- Special Note

"AI-Generated Images are not permitted in any Class. All submitted works must be original photographic images captured by the photographer. Images generated or manipulated using artificial intelligence tools, including but not limited to text-to-image generators or AI-enhanced imaging software, will not be accepted.

Entries in photography should consist of one single photograph only or in the case of a panoramic photo, a series of photos taken at the same time and stitched together. Editing to correct exposure etc with an editing program such as Adobe Lightroom is permitted.

The focus of this show is to celebrate traditional and contemporary photography techniques, and only photographs produced through camera-based methods or digital photography processes are eligible."
